**Nashville Public Television's Appraisal Day Takes Place  
Saturday, June 25, at the Factory at Franklin**



Nashville, Tenn. – Nashville Public Television hosts its annual Antiques & Fine Arts Appraisal Day, 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Saturday, June 25, at the Factory at Franklin, 230 Franklin Rd., Franklin, Tenn., 37064. At the event, attendees meet with regional appraisers and receive a verbal evaluation of their items.

Tickets are **\$75 for up to three items; \$150 for up to six items** and are available for either the morning (9-11 a.m.) or afternoon (1-4 p.m.) session. Attendees may bring items on their own or team up with friends to bring three or six items. All proceeds from Appraisal Day directly support NPT's educational, cultural and civic programming.

**Accepted items include:** Asian items; books; Civil War items; clocks; coins and currency; collectables; documents; English china; European antiques; fine art; fine jewelry; folk art; furniture\*; glass; antique firearms; jewelry; knick-knacks; letters and papers; maps; medals; militaria; model trains; musical instruments; paintings; pop culture; porcelain; posters; pottery; prints; radios; records; sculpture; silver; Southern decorative arts; sporting goods; textiles (quilts, samplers, etc.); toys; trading cards; Victrolas; vintage costume jewelry and watches. Firearms must be unloaded and disarmed. For large items, photographs are acceptable.

Please no arrowheads, burial material, Pre-Columbian items, ammunition or items that cannot be easily transported by one person.

\*For furniture, clear and in-focus photographs of large items are acceptable and should include one showing the size or scale of the item and one offering an overall view. Additional photographs should show close-ups of details such as signatures or maker's marks, the inside of a drawer, and/or any damaged areas, etc.
